PROPHETS AND PROPHECY

In the Old Testament, a prophet was God's mouthpiece. A true prophet spoke what God wanted communicated to His People. A false prophet spoke what they wanted to communicate to God's people.

We generally speak of prophets as people who predict the future. That is not true for biblical prophets. Their mission was always the same: to call people to reform their lives and return to their early love for God. The future event might be the occasion for repentance, but the goal was repentance.

According to the Bible, John the Baptist was the final Old Testament prophet. After John, only Jesus Christ fulfills the role of prophet. (He is also priest and king.) Jesus Christ is God's mouthpiece. The Gospel of John refers to Jesus Christ as the Word of God. Jesus Christ does reveal God's will through the Church; those who belong to Him. The Church is the voice. Jesus Christ the Word.

From time to time, people will predict future cataclysmic events. We often call them prophets; either true or false prophets depending on whether we agree or disagree with them. We waste our time and energy paying attention to the event, "the shiny object", and ignore our need to repent. Like our pets, we are easily distracted.

Repentance is a change of mind and heart that leads to a change of behavior. If we believe that the cause of our problems in life is located somewhere outside ourselves, we will see no need to repent. People who spend large amounts of time studying and propagating theories about future cataclysmic events are certain their lives would be better if other people would change. They see no need to repent themselves.

In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus first words are, "The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the Gospel." Jesus was and is the final prophet. In the Old Testament, most people failed to listen to God's prophets. They failed to repent. When Jesus calls people to repentance, He is speaking to everyone. Including us.


