THE DANIEL DIET?

In the First Chapter of the Book of Daniel, there is a story about the religion of Israel and that of the Babylonians, who conquered Israel in the Sixth Century B.C.

In this passage, Daniel, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were Hebrew youths who were chosen to be trained to serve in the Babylonian court. During their training they would be fed from King's table. Because the meat and wine from the King's table had been sacrificed to the Babylonian gods, Daniel wanted to abstain from eating it. He asked the chief chamberlain to feed him and his friends vegetables and water instead. After ten days, Daniel and his friends were healthier than anyone who ate from the King's table.

The point of the story is that Daniel and his friends were rewarded for remaining steadfast in their refusal to break the First Commandment by "worshipping" other gods.

A few years ago, a group of Christians started practicing what they called, "The Daniel Diet." They consumed only vegetables and water for ten days because they believed the bible reveled this would be a healthy diet. It is healthy to eat five servings of vegetables and to drink one liter of water each day. However, the Bible is not a cookbook. The story in the First Chapter of the Book of Daniel reveals that Daniel was faithful to the Lord even while living in a foreign land with foreign gods. He showed that even though Israel was dispersed among the pagans, they could still maintain their worship of the true God. They did not have to adopt the religious practices of the foreign people they lived among. They could be "in the world, but not of the world."

The Bible reveals how to relate to God while living in the world. It is filled with Divine Wisdom, which may or may not conflict with human wisdom. If there is conflict, the Bible teaches us to choose Divine Wisdom over human wisdom.

Extension of Dispensation from Obligation to attend <u>Holy Mass</u>

On June 24th, Reverend Steven J. Raica, Bishop of Birmingham in Alabama, extended the dispensation from the obligation to attend Holy Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation through Sunday, September 6, 2020.

He also reminds the faithful who, due to concerns about the COVID-19 and /or the prior suspension of public worship, have not fulfilled their "Easter Duty" (the Church's precept to confess mortal sins in number and kind and receive a worthy Holy Communion at least once a year, during the Lent or Easter season), to do so as soon as reasonably possible.
