## THE SACRAMENTS

Last Sunday's Catholic Update on sacraments caused confusion for some parishioners. Joseph Martos, the author, took what is today called, "a multidisciplinary approach." In addition to theology, he added insights from history, anthropology, sociology, and psychology, among other disciplines. Such an approach can be confusing to those unfamiliar with some of those disciplines.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines a Sacrament as, "An efficacious sign of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which divine life is dispensed to us." (Paragraph 1131) I believe Professor Martos would agree with that definition.

Sacraments accomplish what they signify because Christ is at work in them. Christ acts in the sacraments to communicate grace, divine life, during the sacramental rite. For example, when someone is baptized, the sanctifying grace of Baptism is given when the person administering the sacrament pours water over the person's head while saying the words, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." The sign is what is visible: the water and the words. The grace of the sacrament is invisible.

Professor Martos was trying to say that our belief about what is invisible is "essential" and permanent. What is visible can change. At one point in the Church's history, Baptism was done by immersion only. In a later development, pouring water over the person's forehead was allowed. The words spoken by the minister of the sacrament remained the same, though they could be spoken in any language. The belief that the grace of the sacrament is given in the action of the rite remains the same. The invisible is permanent and cannot be altered. The visible is transitory and can be altered.

What is important for us is that we do not give more importance to the visible than we do to the invisible. There can be new translations of sacramental rites. Priests can differ in the way they act out the rites. In those cases, what is essential remains the same. What is non-essential can be changed by the Church. We should give primary importance to what is invisible and essential.
