THE LORD'S DAY

On August 19th, Bishop Steven Raica extended the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation through Sunday, November 22. In his decree, the bishop wrote, "The moral obligation of keeping the Lord's Day holy remains, even for those who use the dispensation and do not go to Mass."

If you read The Acts of the Apostles, you see that Paul and his companions, because they were Jews, attended sabbath services in the local synagogues during their travels. This allowed them to proclaim Jesus of Nazareth as the longpromised Messiah Jews were expecting. Since these services were held on Saturday, the Sabbath, the apostles observed Saturday as the day of rest and worship.

When Paul found no success in converting his Jewish brethren, he went to the Gentiles to proclaim Jesus as "Lord". In Acts, Chapter 20, we read that Paul worshipped with the Gentiles on, "the first day of the week", that is, Sunday. They worshipped in the houses of the leading members of the local Christian community. In the Book of Revelation, John refers to Sunday as, "The Lord's Day". According to scripture, by the end of the First Century Sunday had become The Lord's Day and the Christian Sabbath.

The purpose of the Lord's Day is to worship God, to be free from servile labor, to share time with family, and to perform works of mercy. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, Paragraph 1285.) According to the Book of Revelation, this is also what happens in Heaven. (The "works of mercy" would be to pray for those on earth.) Our observance of the Lord's Day on Sunday is a preparation for the glory of Heaven, where God will be, "all in all". (1Corinthians 15, 28)

Even if you are unable to attend Mass on a given Sunday, it is still important to worship God. You can watch a televised Mass and pray along with the congregation. You can also give time to personal prayer, such as the rosary. What is important is to dedicate time to God, rather than your own pursuits.
