LABOR DAY

The First Monday in September is Labor Day in the United States. The national holiday was created by Congress to salute the accomplishments of American workers. Today, many people look on working as something to escape for something better. For them, Labor Day is now, "The Official End of Summer."

If you read the First Chapter of Genesis, you see that God is a builder. He builds the world we live in to be a temple- a place where He can dwell with His creation. God puts up columns and a dome. He hangs lights in the sky for daytime and nighttime. He puts in the plumbing- the sea. He puts in the floor- the land. When the structure is built, God puts in the living creatures- fish, birds, and land animals. Lastly, as God's crowning achievement, He creates the human beings- the supervisors, who are supposed to maintain God's creation.

In the Gospels, we read that Jesus is a carpenter. There are two reasons for that. First, Jesus's earthly father, Joseph, was a carpenter. In that culture sons usually followed their fathers into whatever profession the father practiced. Second, Jesus was a carpenter because His Heavenly Father was also a builder. Jesus came to build, or maybe renovate, the kingdom of Heaven. He came to restore what His Father had built in the beginning.

For human beings, work is supposed to be how we share in God's creative power. Yes, we work to provide for ourselves and our families. We also work to make the world a better place. We are supposed to be creators rather than destroyers. Greed is a reality that perverts the meaning of work. Greed turns creators into destroyers. Greed believes in scarcity rather than abundance. Greed fails to trust in God's providence or human generosity. Greed is the antithesis of God's creative power.

Ask yourself this question: Am I making the world a better place? Even if you have retired or cannot do physical work, you can still be creative. If you are not able to build structures, you can build up people. The work the Lord has given us to do is to share in His creative power. Let us try to be creators rather than destroyers.
