Father Bill's Weekly Message

THE EIGHTH COMMANDMENT

The Eighth Commandment says, "Thou shall not bear false witness against your neighbor." (Exodus 20, 16; Deuteronomy 5, 20) The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "The eighth commandment forbids misrepresenting the truth in our relations with others." (Paragraph #2464)

The Catechism goes further, "Respect for the reputation of persons forbids every attitude and word likely to cause them unjust injury." The Catechism details more specifically:

Rash Judgment: Assuming as true, without sufficient foundation, the moral fault of another.

Detraction: Disclosing another's faults and failings to persons who did not know them, without an objectively valid reason.

Calumny: Using remarks contrary to the truth to harm the reputation of others and give occasion for false judgments concerning them.

(Paragraph #2477)

Social media has propagated an explosion of violations of the eighth commandment. Talk radio and television "opinion" shows generate enormous revenues from violations of the eighth commandment. Political advertising tries to guide our voting decisions by resorting to violations of the eighth commandment. When we allow ourselves to participate in these media, we put ourselves in the near occasion of sin.

We tend to believe sources of information that tell us what we want to hear. Often, we believe something is true because we want it to be true. The giveaway comes when the person committing a violation of the eighth commandment says, "I'm not saying it's true. I'm just telling you what I've heard." People only repeat something if they want it to be true. If they believe it is false, they don't share it with others.

If we swim in the "sea" of bearing false witness against others, eventually we will swallow some of that "water." Even though we may think of ourselves as being innocent, we are likely to become willing accomplices. Be on guard.




