# ALL HALLOWS EVE

November 1<sup>st</sup> is the Solemnity of All Saints on the Catholic Liturgical Calendar. In Old English, the name of the feast would be, "All Hallows." That would make October 31<sup>st</sup>, "All Hallows Eve", or in Modern English, Halloween.

Though Halloween has become a secular observance in the United States, as have so many events that began as religious festivals, the day does have a religious meaning. In ancient calendars in Ireland and Scotland, November 1<sup>st</sup> was the first day of the new year. Christians wanted to begin the first day of the secular year by celebrating God's victory over sin and death in the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The saints in Heaven were evidence of God's victory over the forces of evil in their lives and in the created world.

The night before an important feast day in the Church was always observed as a vigil: a time of prayer and purposeful waiting. In the Second Epistle of St. Peter, the apostle writes, "We possess the prophetic message that is altogether reliable. You will do well to be attentive to it, as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts." A vigil is a time to believe in divine realities that have yet to be revealed.

Christ is the light of the world. Rather than looking at the darkness, we need to pay attention to the light, no matter how small it may seem to us. As the apostle John wrote about Jesus in his Gospel, "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." Halloween is the vigil of All Saints Day, the celebration of God's victory over sin and death in the lives of the saints.

After my father remarried in 1979 (my mother had died in 1974), my stepmother began a tradition of having a family "open house" on Halloween. Part of the reason for that was to see the Halloween costumes of the grandchildren. It was also a family holiday gathering. It was a time to be together and enjoy each other's company. Holidays can be a time to give thanks to God for the love experienced in our families. There is no reason Halloween cannot be included in holiday celebrations.

# Office of the Bishop

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We celebrate **World Mission Sunday** on **October 18**<sup>th</sup> this year. This annual, worldwide Eucharistic celebration emphasizes our shared baptismal call to mission.

Pope Francis, in his message for World Mission Sunday, implores us, "In this year marked by the suffering and challenges created by the COVID-19 pandemic, the missionary journey of the whole Church continues in light of the words found in the account of the calling of the prophet Isaiah: *"Here I am, send me"* (6:8). This is the ever-new response to the Lord's question: 'Whom shall I send?' This invitation from God's merciful heart challenges both the Church and humanity, in the current world crisis."

During the Mission Month of October, Pope Francis reminds us that, as baptized Christians, we are called *personally* to mission – especially at this time – to bring Christ's love to those most forgotten around the world. Jesus is God the Father's own Missionary; He asks us to respond to this call to mission, this invitation to "step out of ourselves for love of God and neighbor." What will your answer be? "Here I Am, Send Me" is the response we will all endeavor to live out this World Mission Sunday, through *prayer, participation in the Eucharist, and generosity to the collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith*.

Through the Pope's own missionary society, you too can be sent out to all the ends of the earth – sent through your support of missionaries and those they serve. Your gifts sustain priests, religious and lay pastoral leaders in more than 1,100 mission dioceses in Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe as they proclaim the Gospel, build the Church, and serve the poor. With them, you answer, *"Here I Am, Send Me."* 

This year, in response to the challenges to the Mission Church from the pandemic, I invite all of us in this diocese to respond in the most generous way you are able. As you do, I offer my sincere personal gratitude for your kind missionary heart, reaching out in love throughout Mission Month.
