VOCATION AWARENESS WEEK

November 1-7 is National Vocations Awareness Week. It is an opportunity to emphasize religious vocations in service of the Church. God is always calling men and women to serve Him as priests, religious men and women, and deacons. The Church needs religious vocations.

There are two relationships that are part of every religious vocation:

- 1. The individual's relationship to Jesus Christ: He is the one who personally calls people to a vocation. Whatever vocation a person has, it will be lived out through the relationship that person has with Jesus Christ.
- 2. The individual's relationship to the Church: Vocations are personal, not private. If someone is called to a religious vocation, that person is called to serve the Church in some way. Every vocation should build up the Church.

On the topic of vocations, Pope St. John Paul II said, "Everything depends on God, but God has seen fit to make some things depend on us." There are things every Catholic can do to foster Church vocations:

- 1. Pray. Pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood, the religious life, and the diaconate. Pray for those who are already living out vocations.
- 2. Encourage. If you think a person has a religious vocation, encourage them to consider it. They must make the decision, but they may be waiting for someone to affirm what they have been thinking.
- 3. Support Marriages. Every religious vocation began within a family. Stable marriages lead to stable religious vocations.

Happy Vocation Awareness Week! Be sure to thank God for the many saints He has raised up to serve the Church in every age.


