Father Bill's Weekly Message

PEACE

There are four Sundays in Advent. That is why there are four candles on an Advent wreath. The traditional virtues associated with the four Sundays are (in order): Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. The theme of the Second Sunday of Advent is Peace.

Pope St. Paul VI wrote, "If you want peace, work for justice." Peace is not the absence of conflict, but the fruit of justice. As long as there is injustice, either real or imagined, there will be no lasting peace. Wars end, but if the warring parties still believe there is injustice between them, the result may be a cease-fire, but not peace. The seeds of the next war have been sown.

Justice means to give someone what is due to them. Opportunities, understanding, acceptance, respect: these are the components of peace between groups and individuals. If one side or person tries to dominate the other side or person, there can be no peace. Domination may be the goal in business or sports, but it can never be the goal in relationships. There can be no meaningful relationship between people or nations if one or both sides seek to dominate the other.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "Injustice, excessive economic or social inequalities, envy, distrust, and pride raging among men and nations constantly threaten peace. Insofar as men are sinners, war hangs over them and will so continue until Christ comes again; but insofar as they can vanquish sin by coming together in charity, violence will be vanquished." (Paragraph 2317)

When Christ returns, He will establish lasting peace by eradicating injustice. That is part of the promise of the Second Coming. Until then, we Christians can strive to be peacemakers who work to establish justice in our own relationships. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus teaches, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God."

SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

Tuesday, December 8th is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. There will be Masses at 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. Because of the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass issued in the Diocese of Birmingham, you need not attend Mass that day if you have a reason to avoid large gatherings. We will continue to observe the State of Alabama Guidelines for Places of Worship: required social distancing and recommended face coverings. If you can attend Mass on Sunday, you can probably attend Mass on December 8th.
