Father Bill's Weekly Message

A NEW YEAR

Catholics and Protestants look at time differently. Evangelical Protestants see time as unfolding in a straight line. They do not have a liturgical year because that would necessitate going back to the same biblical readings annually. They move forward for fear of "repeating" themselves. The sermons are based on topics, with scripture being used to illustrate the point the preacher is trying to make.

Catholics and most mainline Protestants see time as circular. In the Catholic liturgical year, we repeat the same feasts with their attendant scripture readings annually. This comes from our roots in Judaism. In the synagogue service on the final day of the Jewish year, the last book of the Old Testament, the Book of Chronicles, is read. Then, in the same service, the scripture scroll is rolled back to the beginning and the Book of Genesis is read.

The Catholic belief is that time is less of a circle and more of **a spiral**. The readings and prayers of the liturgy are the same each year, but we are different. Hopefully, we are spiraling upward- growing in holiness. It is also possible we are spiraling downward-becoming hard of heart. The year presents many opportunities for renewal.

The new calendar year gives us the opportunity to examine our lives to see if we are spiraling upward or downward. The liturgy, with the word of God, is the lens we use to examine ourselves. Through word and sacrament, we measure our discipleship of Jesus Christ. We offer ourselves, along with the bread and wine, and ask God to change us and make us more like Christ His Son. The scriptures used in the liturgy reveal to us the details of what and how to change.

Some people believe history repeats itself. Some people believe what is happening now has never happened before. The truth is probably somewhere in the middle. Whether the world around us is the same or different, we can always grow closer to God. We can always grow in holiness.




