#### Father Bill's Weekly Message



## THE FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

Today is the First Sunday of Lent. The Gospel for the First Sunday of Lent is always an account of Jesus being tempted in the desert.

In the scriptures, a temptation is always part of a test. In the Book of Genesis, God tells Adam not to allow anyone to eat from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil found in the Garden of Eden. God is testing Adam to see if Adam will obey. Adam disobeyed God and failed the test. Shame, conflict, suffering, and death followed.

In the desert, Jesus is tempted to disobey God. Three times Satan tempts Jesus to disobey the Father's plan for our salvation and take a quicker, easier waya shortcut. Three times Jesus reminds Satan (and us) that He came, not to do His own will, but to do the will of the One who sent Him. Where Adam failed, Jesus succeeded. It was only after Jesus succeeded that angels arrived to serve Him. The Father seemed absent until the temptations were over. He was not absent. It only seemed so.

In the English version of the Our Father, we ask God to, "lead us not into temptation." In Spanish that phrase is translated as, "do not let us fall into temptation." Perhaps both versions of the Latin original mean, "Do not let us be tested beyond our strength." It is an admission of our weakness rather than saying anything about God's intent.

Lent is a time of temptation because we are trying to be better people. If we had no interest in doing God's will, there would be no reason for Satan to tempt us. Temptations reveal the level of our faith. Following a temptation, we can decide whether or not we want to purify our faith. We purify our faith by removing impurities.

The disciplines of Lent; prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, are a means to purifying our faith. We will eventually experience the temptation to take an easier way of observing Lent- a shortcut. If we remain steadfast in our Lenten disciplines, we will recognize God's help, but only after we experience the temptations- only after we experience our weakness.

# Lenten Regulations

The annual observance of Lent is the special season for the ascent to the holy mountain of Easter. Through its twofold theme of repentance and baptism, the season of Lent disposes both the catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery. Catechumens are led to the Sacraments of Initiation by means of the Rite of Election, the scrutinies, and Catechesis. The faithful, listening more intently to the word of God and devoting themselves to prayer, are prepared through a spirit of repentance to renew their baptismal promises.

The Catholic Church, in an attempt to help Catholics do at least a minimum during Lent, asks all Catholics to fast and abstain from meat on certain days. Fasting means to limit food to one full meal a day with the possibility of two smaller meals (not adding up to a full meal) as needed. Abstinence means not eating meat, although fish is allowed. Catholics are asked to observe all days of fasting and abstinence which is one of the precepts of the Church.

Catholics 14 years of age or older are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

Catholics between the ages of 14 and 59 are also to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If one's work or health make it inadvisable to fast or abstain from meat, they are not obligated to do so.


