



## Today's Readings



**First Reading** — The wrath and the mercy of the Lord are revealed in the exile and liberation of the chosen people (2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23).

**Psalm** — Let my tongue be silenced, if I ever forget you! (Psalm 137).

**Second Reading** — By grace you have been saved (Ephesians 2:4-10).

**Gospel** — The Son was sent by God so that the world might be saved through him (John 3:14-21).

#### I ONCE WAS BLIND BUT NOW I SEE

In the Old Testament, one of the acts promised of the Messiah was that he would, "give sight to the blind." (Isaiah 61) This is meant on two levels. The Messiah, the Lord's Anointed, would heal the physically blind. He would also give sight to the spiritually blind. Both levels of meaning would be signs of the Lord's presence.

In Chapter 9 of the Gospel of John, Jesus heals a man born blind. The man's physical healing is immediate. His spiritual healing is gradual. He refers to Jesus as "the man" (verse 11); a prophet (verse 17); from God (verse 33); and finally, "Lord" (verse 38). By the end of the passage the formerly blind man sees (understands) clearly who Jesus is. Jesus uses the occasion to point out that his enemies are able to see physically but are still spiritually blind. They need healing, too.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Nicodemus comes to Jesus "at night." That means he has trouble seeing Jesus both physically and spiritually. Jesus tries to "enlighten" him. Nicodemus understands (sees) things on a physical level. Jesus tries to show him a deeper meaning. Nicodemus is spiritually blind even though he has physical sight. Nicodemus is not an enemy of Jesus. Like the man born blind, Nicodemus needs to be healed of his spiritual blindness so that he can call Jesus, "Lord."

For catechumens, those preparing for baptism at Easter, Lent is referred to as "the Period of Enlightenment." It is a time of deeper reflection on the person of Jesus. Rather than learning more about what the Church teaches, it is an opportunity to learn more about who Jesus is. Lent is a time to contemplate John 3, 16: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life."

For all of us Lent can be a Period of Enlightenment. First, we must admit that we are spiritually blind. Then Jesus can heal us.
