

Father Bill's Weekly Message

HOLY WEEK 2021

Perhaps the best thing that can be said about Holy Week this year is that it is not the same as Holy Week last year. There is no lock down. Whoever wants to attend Mass can, as long as they maintain social distancing. We are not yet back to normal. Maybe that is a good thing.

In truth, every Holy Week should be different for us. The readings are the same every year. The liturgies are the same every year. But we are supposed to be different. The difference in us makes Holy Week different each year.

Hardships bring with them opportunities. The lives of the saints teach us that suffering can lead to a purification of our faith. We can depend more on God and less on the comforts we turn to sometimes without thinking. We can spend more time in prayer, deepening our relationship with God. We can be concerned about the suffering of others and be less self-absorbed. In other words, this past year has been a lot like Lent: an opportunity to purify our faith.

How did we use the opportunity God gave us in the past year? Did we deepen our relationship to Him, turning to Him more than we usually do? Did we become new people? Better people? On Easter Sunday we make a renewal of our Baptismal promises. We renew our rejection of sin and commitment to God. In order to be sincere in what we say, we must practice the disciplines of Lent in a wholehearted way. Holy Week is the final opportunity to purify our faith before Easter.

When it comes to repentance, it is never too late to begin. Today we can shift our focus away from ourselves and the world. We can renew our focus on God. The events of Holy Week changed the world. Only we can decide if those same events make a difference in our lives.

Swieconka*Blessing of the Baskets Bishop Steven Raica Cathedral of St. Paul Holy Saturday, April 3rd 9:00 am All are welcome!

*Swieconka (sh-vee-en-soon-kah) is one of the most enduring and beloved Polish traditions. Baskets containing a sampling of Easter foods are brought to church to be blessed on Holy Saturday. The food is shared on Easter morning in a ritual breaking of the fast. Observing the beautiful foods and creations of other parishioners is one of the special joys of the event.

BELL TOWER FUND DRIVE

The parish has received architectural renderings for a tower to house a bell. The bell has been purchased and fitted for automatic ringing. The total cost of the project is approximately \$100,000.00. We have a pledge of \$25,000.00. PASTORAL COUNCIL ELECTION

The Parish Pastoral Council is a consultative body.

The Pastor consults the members to get feedback on pastoral initiatives and to find out the needs of the parish.

The Council is made up of nine members serving staggered three-year terms. The year begins

in July and ends the following June. Elections for new members are held in May.

If you would like to nominate yourself or someone else as a candidate, contact the parish office. If you nominate someone else, be sure to get their permission before nominating them.

Lenten Regulations

The annual observance of Lent is the special season for the ascent to the holy mountain of Easter. Through its twofold theme of repentance and baptism, the season of Lent disposes both the catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery. Catechumens are led to the Sacraments of Initiation by means of the Rite of Election, the scrutinies, and Catechesis. The faithful, listening more intently to the word of God and devoting themselves to prayer, are prepared through a spirit of repentance to renew their baptismal promises.

The Catholic Church, in an attempt to help Catholics do at least a minimum during Lent, asks all Catholics to fast and abstain from meat on certain days. Fasting means to limit food to one full meal a day with the possibility of two smaller meals (not adding up to a full meal) as needed. Abstinence means not eating meat, although fish is allowed. Catholics are asked to observe all days of fasting and abstinence which is one of the precepts of the Church.

Catholics 14 years of age or older are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

Catholics between the ages of 14 and 59 are also to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If one's work or health make it inadvisable to fast or abstain from meat, they are not obligated to do so.
