Father Bill's Weekly Message

THE GOOD SHEPHERD

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is called Good Shepherd Sunday in the Catholic Church. That is because the Gospel reading comes from the Tenth Chapter of the Gospel of John, where Jesus says, "I am the Good Shepherd." This Sunday is also World Day of Prayer for Vocations.

The great leaders of the Old Testament, Moses and David, were shepherds before God called them to lead His people. God wanted the leaders of His people to be like shepherds, who brought back the strays and provided safety and sustenance for the "flock" that belonged to Him. The shepherd-leaders were stewards, but God was the owner of the People of God.

Jesus is the Good Shepherd. He not only tends the flock of those who belong to Him, He is the owner of the flock. In His passion, Jesus laid down His life for His sheep. He died to protect them from the Adversary, who is a predator who wants to destroy whatever belongs to God. Satan wants to snatch those who belong to the Good Shepherd.

If Jesus is the Good Shepherd, then the Church is the flock He shepherds. As members of the flock, we follow where Jesus Christ leads, rather than going where we want to go. Sometimes the Good Shepherd leads us into unfamiliar places. When that happens, we are called to trust that He will provide for us. As we read in Psalm 23: "Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil, for you are at my side with your rod and your staff that give me courage."

When a presiding bishop functions as the leader of the liturgy of His diocese, he carries a staff, called a crozier. It is modeled after a shepherd's staff. The bishop is the shepherd of the local Church. God is the owner of that Church. The model of the bishop is Jesus Christ; the Good Shepherd, who lays down His life for His sheep.

BELL TOWER FUND DRIVE

The parish has received architectural renderings for a tower to house a bell. The bell has been purchased and fitted for automatic ringing. The total cost of the project is approximately \$100,000. We have a pledge of \$30,000 and collected an additional \$4,357 as of April 1, 2021. The rest of the cost will need to be raised <u>before</u> a contract can be signed by Bishop Raica and construction can begin.
