JOURNEY TO THE SYNOD

Pope Francis will meet with the General Synod of Bishops from around the world in October of 2023. In preparation for that meeting, all bishops are to have a special period of prayer, dialogue, and discernment in their local churches.

According to Bishop Steven Raica, our bishop, "The purpose of this preparatory period is to have a shared experience of 'journeying together', walking closely with our Lord and announcing his Good News to the world." The results of this two-year process will then guide the bishops in their gathering in Rome in 2023.

This will be a time to listen to the Holy Spirit and to each other so that we can follow the promptings of the Spirit as He guides the Diocese of Birmingham to be an instrument of salvation through Jesus Christ.

This "Journey to the Synod" begins in our diocese next weekend, with the Masses for the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time. This will begin a Period of Prayer and Communion, lasting through Advent. There will be regional and parish "Community Dialogues" in January and February. The results of the dialogues will be synthesized during Lent. The Easter season (April 17- June 5) will be a time of Pastoral Planning to put into practice what has been discerned. Pentecost Sunday will begin the phase of implementing the results of the discernment.

Later, the results of this entire process can be evaluated and adjusted to more closely adhere to the will of the Holy Spirit. Those results will guide the bishops of the General Assembly as they discern further where the Holy Spirit is leading the Church in the present time.

Next weekend we begin the two-year synodal process of listening to the promptings of the Holy Spirit guiding the Church. Pray that God's will be done.


The Christian Love Pantry


