

HALLOWEEN

October 31st is Halloween. The name "Halloween" comes from the Old English, "All Hallows Eve". All Hallows is what we moderns call All Saints. Halloween is the evening before All Saints Day, which is celebrated on November 1st.

If you don't acknowledge All Saints Day, then you are left with Halloween being a day (or night) of evil. It becomes only a pagan festival asking for protection from evil spirits. People dress up in costumes so they will be hidden from demons. Lanterns made with pumpkins are used to shine light in dark places, where evil dwells. Black cats, witches, and ghosts terrorize humans. All of this becomes identified with Halloween if that day is separated from All Saints Day.

All Saints Day is a celebration of faith in God's victory over sin and death. The saints share in Christ's victory in the resurrection. Though sin and death are real, we believe God's love is stronger. It is a day to honor the saints and praise God who created and redeemed them.

Every important day in the Church Liturgical Calendar has a vigil. Christmas Eve, the Easter Vigil, and, more recently, the Vigil of Pentecost are holy times of waiting and preparing for the celebration of important feasts in the Church Year. Perhaps Halloween could be observed the same way.

It can be a time of religious and family celebration. It can be a time of prayer and rejoicing because of God's love; shown in this case in the saints achieving faith's goal: eternal life. We can remember our loved ones who have died and pray to God for their salvation. We can contemplate a hoped-for reunion with those who have gone before us: The family reunion to end all family reunions!

Halloween, All Saints Day, and All Souls Day follow each other in quick succession. They can be one celebration of faith in God's promise of eternal life. God is the God of treats, not tricks.




