Today's Readings

ALL SOULS DAY

November 2^{nd} on the Church Liturgical Calendar is The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed or, more popularly, All Souls Day.

In the Latin Language, the noun comes before the adjective. In English the adjective comes before the noun it describes. So, in proper English the name of November 2nd would be the Commemoration of All the Departed Faithful. In Church terminology, the Faithful are the members of the Church who have been baptized and received sanctifying grace. On this day we remember (commemorate) deceased Christians who have yet to attain Heaven.

"The Church has encouraged prayer for the dead from the earliest times as an act of Christian charity. 'If we had no care for the dead' Augustine noted, 'we would not be in the habit of praying for them.'

The theological underpinning of the feast is the acknowledgement of human frailty. Since few people achieve perfection in this life but, rather, go to the grave still scarred with traces of sinfulness, some period of purification seems necessary before a soul comes face-to-face with God. The Council of Trent affirmed this purgatory state and insisted that the prayers of the living can speed the process of purification." (Lives of the Saints, Franciscan Media)

We pray for the Departed Faithful at every Mass. For example, in Eucharistic Prayer II we pray," Remember also our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection, and all who have died in your mercy: welcome them into the light of your face."

November, the final month of the Church's Liturgical Year, is the Month of the Holy Souls in Purgatory. Eternal life is guaranteed for these Departed Faithful, but their purification is yet to be completed. We pray on November 2nd and every other day that they will attain the eternal, unbroken union with God that is the goal of every human life.


The Christian Love Pantry

All Saints Day

All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church celebrated annually on November 1. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven. It should not be confused with All Souls' Day, which is observed on November 2, and is dedicated to those who have died and not yet reached heaven.

All Saints' Day was formally started by Pope Boniface IV, who consecrated the Pantheon at Rome to the Virgin Mary and all the Martyrs on May 13 in 609 AD. Boniface IV also established All Souls' Day, which follows All Saints.

All Saints' Day is not a Catholic Holy Day of Obligation this year.


