JOURNEY TO THE SYNOD/PRAYER AND COMMUNION

Some years ago, when I was at another parish, the deacon was preaching on a particular weekend. I saw him during the week and he told me, "I think I figured out what I want to say this Sunday." I responded, "Have you figured out what God wants you to say?"

The first part of the Synodal Process that the whole Church is on leading up to the General Synod of Bishops in 2023 is called "Prayer and Communion" by Bishop Raica. It is a time of prayer, asking the Holy Spirit to guide us as we discern what God wants us to say. The "saying" part will come early next year. First, we need to pray so we can have greater certainty that what we are saying is what God wants us to say rather than only what we want to say.

How do we evaluate where we end and where the Spirit begins? There are some sources of God's revelation that will help us. First, there is the Bible. It is God's Word in human words. It is a record of how people have encountered God through the centuries. Sometimes it is an example of how people are supposed to respond to God. Sometimes it is a warning of how not to respond.

Next is Tradition. It is a record of how people have applied the Revelation of God in the Bible to the situation of their own time. Again, sometimes it gives an example to be followed and sometimes one to be avoided. It is the same Holy Spirit who has guided the Church in every generation, even if we have done a poor job in following the Spirit.

Before we speak about the role of the Church in the 21st century, we need to pray that God will guide our words. Whatever we come up with should be consistent with what is found in the Bible and Tradition. In both cases it is the same Holy Spirit at work.

An opportunity for prayer happens Monday when we have a Holy Hour with Bishop Raica in our church from 7:00-8:00 p.m.


The Christian Love Pantry
