# FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT- HOPE

There are four Sundays during the season of Advent. This year, Advent lasts from the evening of November 27<sup>th</sup> until the evening of December 24<sup>th</sup>. (In the Jewish Calendar, the day begins at sunset.)

The theme of the First Sunday and week of Advent is **HOPE**. The Theological Virtue of Hope is the belief that we have a future controlled by God. It is more than wishful thinking. It is based on the word of Jesus Christ and the experience of the Church through history.

In 2007, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI authored an encyclical entitled, <u>Spe</u> <u>Salvi</u>, that is, <u>In Hope We Were Saved</u>. In the Introduction, he writes, "According to the Christian faith, "redemption" is not simply a given. Redemption is offered to us in the sense that we have been given hope, trustworthy hope, by virtue of which we can face our present: the present can be lived and accepted if it leads towards a goal, if we can be sure of this goal, and if this goal is great enough to justify the effort of the journey."

Ancient mariners sailed at night by the guidance of the North Star. It was a fixed point they could use to guide their journeys. They would not sail off-course because the North Star gave them reassurance that they were headed in the right direction, even if they had yet to reach their goal. The North Star was always ahead of them to point the way.

Hope is like that. It is a fixed point that reassures us we will reach our goal if we follow Jesus Christ, who is the Light of the World. Our hope is not in ourselves, no matter how capable we may be in "navigating" life. Our hope is in Jesus Christ, who is the North Star placed in plain sight to guide us.


# The Christian Love Pantry

## 1st Sunday of Advent

Beginning the Church's liturgical year, Advent (from, "ad-venire" in Latin or "to come to") is the season encompassing the four Sundays (and weekdays) leading up to the celebration of Christmas.

The Advent season is a time of **preparation** that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas. From the earliest days of the Church, people have been fascinated by Jesus' promise to come back. But the scripture readings during Advent tell us not to waste our time with predictions. Advent is not about speculation. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world (Lk 21:34-36). Like Lent, the liturgical color for Advent is purple since both are seasons that prepare us for great feast days. Advent also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas.




