### Father Bill's Weekly Message

### SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT- PEACE

During the Mass for the Second Sunday of Advent we light two candles. The first candle represents hope. The second candle represents peace.

The Hebrew word for peace is *Shalom*. *Shalom* means that everything is the way it is supposed to be. Everything is the way God created it to be. That is what Jesus is talking about when He says at the Last Supper, "Peace is my gift to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you." (John 14, 27)

The Roman Empire brought the *Pax Romana*, that is, the Peace of Rome. They maintained it at the point of a spear. Rome used its military might to subjugate peoples. Anyone who threatened the empire's dominance was eliminated. There were winners and losers. The emperor (Caesar) was given the titles "Son of the gods", "Savior", and "Prince of Peace". He was even worshipped by the offering of incense to his image.

St. Luke's Gospel refers to Jesus as, "the Son of God" (1, 35), "savior", and "Lord" (2, 11). The title "Lord" is reserved for God alone. Luke is forcing his readers to make a choice: Whose way will bring you peace, Caesar's or Jesus'? Whose kingdom will you live in, Caesar's or Jesus'? Who will you serve, Caesar or Jesus?

The Peace of Jesus Christ comes when our lives are ordered according to God's plan. It is not dependent on dominating one group or another. Outside forces cannot steal it from us. It comes from the belief that our lives are proceeding according to God's plan, even if we don't know what's next. If we cooperate with God's plan for our lives, we will experience a peace the world cannot give.

Advent is an opportunity to order our lives according to God's plan, so we can experience the peace that only Jesus Christ can give.



### **The Advent Wreath**

Advent is a time of joy, when we happily look forward to the coming of Jesus. Today's Gospel reading tells about how Saint John the Baptist went around telling everyone to repent and prepare for the coming of the Messiah.

An **Advent wreath** is a symbol of the coming of Jesus, our Light, into the world. It has three purple candles and one pink candle. One candle is lit on the first week of Advent, and one more is added every week until Christmas. Every week it gets aa bit brighter because we are getting closer to Jesus' coming at Christmas.

The purple candles stand for repentance-being sorry and making up for our sins. The pink candle represents joy. It is lit on the 3rd week of Advent because we rejoice that the waiting is half over.




