Father Bill's Weekly Message

IT'S CHRISTMAS TIME!

No, this message was not supposed to go out weeks or months ago. In the Catholic Church's Liturgical Calendar, sunset on December 24th is the **beginning** of the Christmas Season. It lasts until the completion of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (This year on January 9th).

Besides the Nativity of the Lord (December 25th), there are important feasts connected to the Incarnation of Jesus Christ. There is the Feast of the Holy Family (which we celebrate today). There is the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God (January 1st). There is the Epiphany of the Lord (observed this year on January 2nd). Finally, there is the Baptism of the Lord. In addition, there are important days honoring St. Stephen, St. John the Evangelist, and the Holy Innocents.

The readings and prayers focus on the true human nature of Jesus Christ. The Son of God, the Second Person of the Trinity, took on all the limitations of being human. He even experienced the shame of dying on a cross. (Philippians 2, 8) He is truly human (Christ) and truly God (Lord).

In the First Letter of St. John, we read: "This is how we can know the Spirit of God: every spirit that acknowledges Jesus Christ come in the flesh belongs to God, and every spirit that does not acknowledge Jesus does not belong to God. This is the spirit of the antichrist that...is already in the world." (4, 2-3)

The Christmas Season is an opportunity to contemplate the Incarnation of Jesus Christ. God redeemed His creation and made it an instrument of salvation. Jesus saves us through His humanity as well as His divinity. The Church, founded by Jesus Christ, is the chosen instrument of salvation. Like Jesus, it is both human and divine. Salvation depends completely on Jesus Christ, but he has chosen His Church as the instrument of His saving grace.

Christ is born. He has come indeed. Merry Christmas!




