A NEW YEAR?


The calendar has flipped. It is a different year than it was a few days ago. But is it new? We mark time by how long it takes the earth to revolve around the sun. Each revolution is one year. The days are marked by the time it takes the earth to spin one revolution on its invisible axis. Part of that time we face the sun and part of that time we face away from the sun. Each month is marked by the orbit of the moon around the earth, which is calculated by the sun's reflection on the moon. Every calculation depends on the sun.

For Christians, every calculation depends on the Son of God, Jesus Christ. Our worlds, our lives, revolve around Him. We are satellites of the Son of God. The Son is our fixed point that does not move. We move in relation to Him.

In the Greek language of the New Testament there are two words that are translated as "time". One is *Chronos*, which is time as seconds, minutes, hours, days, months and years. According to *Chronos*, we have crossed into a different year. The other word for "time" in Greek is *Kairos*. It means an opportunity, as in, "now is the time".

What will make this year new is seizing the opportunity to acknowledge Jesus Christ as the center of our lives. That will require decisions and action in addition to words. If Jesus is not the center of our lives, it may be another year, but not a new year. We must live as if Jesus Christ is the center of our lives because He truly is. Our lives truly revolve around Him.

For centuries people mistakenly thought the earth was the center of the solar system and everything revolved around us. Some people still believe everything revolves around them. Christians believe everything revolves around Jesus Christ.


