

Father Bill's Weekly Message

THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD


The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is the conclusion of the liturgical season of Christmas. That tells us this event reveals something about the humanity of Jesus Christ.

The Gospels tell us that John's baptism was a baptism of repentance, "for the forgiveness of sins." A person repented of their sins and was baptized by John as an outward sign of what had happened inside them. The actual baptism changed nothing. The repentance, the change of mind, had already taken place.

John tells the crowds that one mightier than him will come after him. John says, "He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." (Matthew 3, 11) That someone is Jesus Christ. The baptism given by Jesus Christ is different from the baptism given by John. It is superior to John's baptism. The baptism of Jesus Christ gives the Holy Spirit. It changes the person who receives it.

Then why did Jesus receive John's baptism? Jesus never sinned. He had no need to repent. Jesus accepting John's baptism shows His complete identification with humanity. As the Letter to the Hebrews states, "We do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who has similarly been tested in every way, yet without sin." (4, 15) Jesus knows what is to be human. Therefore, we can approach Him when we need forgiveness of our sins. He will sympathize with us.

The baptism of Jesus in the Jordan river also prefigures His death on the cross. In Luke's Gospel Jesus says, "There is a baptism with which I must be baptized, and how great is my anguish until it is accomplished." (12, 50) The Letter to the Philippians states, "(Jesus) humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross. (2, 8) Jesus experienced everything we human beings experience, even death. He is trustworthy because He knows what it means to be human.



Columbarium News




