Father Bill's Weekly Message

THE BIBLE AND RACE

According to Genesis, Chapter One, when God created Adam and Eve, He instructed them, "Be fruitful and multiply, fill the earth and subdue it." (v. 28) The result of human beings "filling the earth" would be that people would look different. Those who settled closer to the equator would have darker skin and thicker hair. Those who settled farther from the equator would have lighter skin and thinner hair.

All races are created by God, who is the only God. Therefore, according to the Bible, there is no superior race. A superior race would necessitate more than one creator, which would be an affront to God's majesty. All people are descendants of Adam and Eve and, through them, Noah and his wife, and their sons and their wives. (Genesis, Chapters 7-9)

What about slavery? The slaves mentioned in the bible were members of conquered peoples who were defeated in wars. The slavery practiced in the 16th - 19th century was based on the belief that some people were "sub-human". Because of this belief, they could be the property of human beings (like pets). This practice was a contradiction of biblical revelation, though some people who should have known better practiced it. They committed blasphemy by claiming the bible sanctioned it.

People who say they believe in "racehorse theory", "replacement theory", "eugenics", "white separatism", and other white supremacy ideologies contradict the Revelation of God in the scriptures. The fact that they use Christian symbols and claim to be Christian is nonsense. Anyone who believes the Bible is truly the word of God cannot submit to these beliefs.

Having grown up in Birmingham, Alabama, I witnessed white supremacy first-hand. I still witness it today. Last November, standing in line to vote I heard several white males using the "N-word". Some of them were adorned with Christian symbols. White supremacy is alive and well. However, no one can be a white supremacist and believe the teachings of the Roman Catholic Church. You must choose.



The Start of Ordinary Time

Now that the Christmas season has officially ended for us Catholics, we have reached what is known as Ordinary Time in the Liturgical Year. Poinsettias begin to wilt, the vestments worn during mass return to green, and all of the nativity scenes and wreaths are packed away until next Advent.

Oftentimes, Catholics associate Ordinary time with mundaneness, or, a lack of excitement due to its name. However, Ordinary Time was named in reference to *ordinance*, or *ordinal*. Father Bill likens it to the military usage of the word *ordinance*, which is synonymous with "to reach a target".

When understood this way, then Ordinary Time becomes a time of continued preparation for the season that is to come: Lent and Easter. Some things you can do to take the monotony out of your Ordinary Time routine are: focus on the life of Christ, learn about the lives of Saints, and try new prayers and devotions with your family.


