# Today's Readings

**Second Reading** — Paul reminds us of the gospel he preached through which we are saved, if we believe it. (1 Corinthians 15:1-11 [3-8, 11]).

**Gospel** — Jesus directs Simon to take his boat into deep water for a miraculous catch of fish. Simon and his partners leave all to follow Jesus (Luke 5:1-11).

### PRAYER TO ST. MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL

Pope St. Leo XIII first published a prayer to St. Michael the Archangel in 1886. It was based on the scripture passage found in the Book of Revelation, Chapter 12, 7-9, where God's angels, led by St. Michael defeat Satan and his angels and cast them out of Heaven. The devil and his angels were thrown down to earth (v. 9), where they wage war against the offspring of God, that is, the Church (v. 17).

There have been different editions of the prayer. There are official and unofficial translations. The one used in our parish is:

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in the hour of battle.

Be our safeguard against the wickedness and snares
of the Devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray,
and do Thou, O Prince of the Heavenly host,
by the power of God, thrust into Hell Satan, and, with him,
all the other evil spirits who prowl about the world
seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

The prayer was prayed at the conclusion of weekday Mass in the parish before my arrival. In the Fall of 2018, when more revelations of clergy sexual abuse in the Church came to light, some parishioners asked if we could pray the prayer at Sunday Mass as well.

In Matthew, Chapter 16, Jesus promises Peter that "the gates of hell" will not prevail against the Church. Jesus never promised that the Devil would stop trying to destroy the Church, just that he would never succeed. Satan's goal is to separate us from God. We need spiritual help to prevent that from happening. God sends St. Michael the Archangel to assist us.

# Columbarium News

The columbarium will consist of 80 niches which can hold the urns of two people. Contract for selection and use of the niches is allowed after full receipt of payment which is \$3,000.




