

### Father Bill's Weekly Message

### HE IS RISEN INDEED

In his book on the virtue of hope, Pope Benedict XVI wrote that Christians believe we always have a future. That is what hope is about: believing the future will succeed the present. Good or bad, the present will always give way to the future. For Christians, the future means a future with God. Our hope is in God rather than anyone else.

In the United States during the 20<sup>th</sup> century, a belief developed that children would have a better life than their parents. The "better" was defined along the lines of wealth or longevity. It was believed the struggles of one generation would deliver the next generation from the same difficulties. It was founded on belief in human progress. Because of that, this belief in a better future has its limits. Some lives meet the expectation and some fail to meet it.

The future that belongs to God has no such limitations. God's future is not to be judged by human standards. It comes when God's will is done perfectly. It is in God's hands, but it is also offered freely to human beings. Humans have no control over it. God's future is like a city we can decide to move to or move away from. We don't build it. We can only be its inhabitants.

The resurrection of Jesus Christ shows us God's future. It is also our hope for ourselves and our loved ones. We do not hope for a better life than those who have gone before us, but the same life the saints in Heaven already enjoy. There is no progress because it is already complete. The only thing lacking is our willingness to be part of it.

The resurrection gives us a different standard to live by and a different future to live for. The standard is that of Jesus Christ and the future is that which belongs to God.


