Father Bill's Weekly Message

THE IMPORTANCE OF SUNDAY

Not all Christians observe Sunday as "the Lord's Day." There are those who observe Saturday as the Sabbath. There are those who treat Sunday like any other day, except that they "go to church" on Sunday morning. What does Sunday mean for a Christian?

In the Acts of the Apostles, Paul begins his missionary preaching trying to convince Jews that Jesus is the Messiah, the Christ. At that time, Jews gathered on Saturday, the sabbath, for worship. In order to get the message about Jesus to as many people as possible, Paul went to the synagogue on Saturday.

But Paul's message was largely rejected. So, in Chapter 13 of Acts Paul announces that he will begin preaching to the Gentiles. By Chapter 20, we read that Paul worshipped with the Gentiles on, "the first day of the week." That would be Sunday. In the final book of the New Testament, The Book of Revelation, the apostle John writes, "I was caught up in the spirit on the Lord's day." Now Sunday has become known as the Lord's Day.

The Church chose Sunday as the day of worship because it was the day Jesus Christ rose from the dead. In the words of St. Justin in the early Second century: "We all gather on the day of the sun, for it is the first day when God, separating matter from darkness, made the world; and on this same day Jesus Christ our Savior rose from the dead."

Sunday is the pre-eminent day for the liturgical assembly, when the faithful gather "to listen to the word of God and take part in the Eucharist, thus calling to mind the Passion, Resurrection and glory of the Lord Jesus, and giving thanks to God who 'has begotten them again, by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead' unto a living hope." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1167)

Hundreds of thousands of Alabama adults have no health coverage. 
