Father Bill's Weekly Message

A CULTURE OF LIFE (Reprinted from the May 29th Bulletin)

The news has been abuzz recently with a leak from the Supreme Court that the 1973 Roe vs Wade decision may be overturned. It may be that abortion will go back to being a state issue.

We live in a culture of death. Criminalizing abortion will not change that. Pope St. John Paul II, in his encyclical <u>Veritatis Splendor</u> (1992), called on all people of good will to promote a culture of life throughout the world. Since then, we seem to be losing ground in the United States.

Where is the evidence of a culture of death? It can be found in the increase of violent deaths. Whether by murder, suicide, or some other means, the average lifespan of people in the United States is decreasing over the last three years. It can be found in the increase in drug addiction among all segments of the population. It can be found in the proliferation of weapons and their use in resolving disputes. It can be found in the decrease in births, which have fallen below "Replacement Rate" in our country during the last decade. (The population in the United States is decreasing.)

Even if Roe vs Wade is sent back to the states to decide, we will be far from having a culture of life in our country. Will there be a March for Life without Roe vs. Wade? There needs to be.

In a culture of life every human being has value. No one, for whatever reason, should be neglected. A culture of life would support mothers before **and after** they give birth. A culture of life would provide resources for mental health to anyone who needs them. A culture of life would value children, the elderly, and anyone else who is vulnerable because of their condition. We would protect the weak instead of exploiting them.


The conference theme is **"Thy Will Be Done."** The main speaker will be **Andi Oney** along with **Father Frankline Fomukong and Jackie Smoke.**






STATEMENT ON SUPREME COURT DECISION DOBBS V. JACKSON WOMEN'S HEALTH ORGANIZATION

Today, the U.S. Supreme Court issued a major opinion regarding *Dobbs v. Jackson (Mississippi) Women's Health Organization* effectively overturning its previous 1973 decision known as *Roe v. Wade.* Through ongoing pro-life initiatives, including the March for Life, we have advocated for this outcome for 49 years. We are grateful for and laud the Court for its nuanced opinion.

As a Catholic community, along with many people of good will, we are mindful, as we have always been, of the obligation incumbent upon us to care for one another. The powerful words from God addressed to Jeremiah clearly remind us: "Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you..." (cf. Jer 1:5). Advances in biological science clearly underscore the unique dignity of every human life, from the very first moment of conception. It requires an extra effort on our part to sustain and protect life as a gift from God. We, therefore, urge the ongoing accompaniment of families and individuals, especially women and children, both born and unborn.

With this decision, it now will be up to individual state legislatures to regulate abortion as a matter of state public policy. For us, it is time to refocus and expand our energies within the State of Alabama to support all human life, especially the most vulnerable. Today's decision marks a major step forward in constructing a culture of life. Over time, a culture of life becomes a culture of hope that honors and respects all.

Our pathway forward will require us to be even more engaged to ensure that fundamental rights are protected. Partnering with people of good will, we can share the common dream of our founders, that all are imbued by the Creator with unalienable rights, including the right to life. A nation that respects and fosters the right to life is a nation with a bright future. Much work remains to be done. Together, we seek to ensure that all are welcome as sisters and brothers in our human family.
