

Father Bill's Weekly Message

INFORMATION OR PROVOCATION?

I hear people say that when they watch the news on television, they get angry. My response to that is, "Stop watching the news on television."

For years I watched the national "news" and the evening "commentary" shows on news channels. Slowly, I had a growing sense that I was being manipulated. I didn't like that feeling, so I stopped watching those shows. The programs were trying to incite me to anger so I would watch them more often. The reason for that was so they could increase their viewership and charge more for their advertising. They did not care about truth or facts. They were using me to get more attention so they could make more money.

As someone who spent a great deal of my life manipulating others to get attention, I understand how that works. It was a great lesson in how other people felt around me as I was manipulating them. "News" shows don't want to inform their viewers or listeners. They want to provoke them. The more provocative they are, the higher their ratings will be, and the more money they will make.

When people tell me about something they saw or heard on the news, I give it "the smell test." If it smells "fishy", there is probably some form of manipulation going on. Someone is trying to deceive their viewers or listeners to get them "fired up" and pay more attention to that "news" source. If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is. If it sounds too bad to be true, it probably is.

What information people want to consume reveals a lot about them rather than about the state of the world. However, if something or someone causes you to sin, you should distance yourself from whatever or whoever that is. If you don't, the responsibility is yours.

MEDICAID EXPANSION

With the reversal of the Roe vs. Wade Supreme Court decision, abortion is now illegal in Alabama. That means the expansion of Medicaid is a Pro-life issue. With more poor women carrying their babies to term, pre-natal and post-natal care will need to be increased, especially in rural areas of our state.

If you support mothers and their babies, then logically you must support an increase in medical care for women and children as an alternative to abortion. In Alabama, that means the expansion of Medicaid.




