

#### Father Bill's Weekly Message

# EXCERPT FROM A TALK GIVEN TO PRIESTS, DEACONS AND SEMINARIANS AT ARS BY POPE ST. JOHN PAUL II (1986)

You know the saying of the Cure' d'Ars: "Oh, the priest is something great! If he knew it, he would die!" Indeed, what a wonderful thing it is to exercise our threefold priestly ministry as bishops or priests, a ministry that is indispensable to the Church.

-the ministry of the one who proclaims the Good News: to make Jesus Christ known; to put men into a true relationship with him; to watch over the authenticity and fidelity of the Faith, so that it may neither be lacking nor changed nor sclerotic; and also keep alive in the Church the impulse of evangelization, and form apostolic workers.


-the ministry of one who dispenses the mysteries of God: to make them present in an authentic manner, especially to make present the paschal mystery by means of the Eucharist and of forgiveness of sins; to permit the baptized to have access to these, and to prepare them for this. The laity will never be able to be delegated to such ministries; a priestly ordination, which permits one to act in the name of Christ the Head, is necessary.

-the ministry, finally, of the pastor: to build up and maintain the Communion among Christians, in the community that is entrusted to us, with the other diocesan communities, all linked to the successor of Peter. Before any specialization in view of his personal competences, and in accord with his bishop, the priest is in fact the minister of Communion: in a Christian community that often risks rupture or closing in on itself, he ensures both the gathering together of the family of God and its openness. His priesthood confers on him the power to lead the priestly people."

Please pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood for our diocese and from our parish.


