Father Bill's Weekly Message

BEING CHRIST TO OTHERS

September is the month for the annual Catholic Charities and Communities pledge drive for 2023. The theme for this year's drive is, "Being Christ to Others."

Many of you have already received your pledge card in the mail. We will be collecting them at Mass the weekend of September 24th and 25th. However, if you want to mail them in now, that is not a problem. Send it in!

The donations given to Catholic Charities and Communities goes to support the many apostolates sponsored by the Diocese of Birmingham. But all the Diocese is asking for right now is a pledge of what you promise to contribute in 2023. You will have all 12 months of 2023 to fulfill your pledge.

Last year, the largest Catholic Charities and Communities allocation went to support our diocesan Catholic Social Services work. This includes the Centers of Concern located throughout the Diocese, Catholic Family Services, and Disaster Relief Services. Collectively, these apostolates assisted more than 52,000 people in 2021.

Another major focus of Catholic Charities and Communities funds is for education. This includes Catholic Schools, parish-based religious education, Catholic Campus Ministry, and Vocations. We are building up the future of the Church in North Alabama by forming more than 10,000 students in the Catholic faith. This includes the 14 seminarians who will be sponsored by our Diocese this Fall.

The cost of administration of the Catholic Charites and Communities pledge drive and office is 6%. That means 94 cents of every dollar given goes to assist the Diocese of Birmingham in bringing the love and mercy of Jesus Christ to those in most need of it.

Throughout the month of September, I will be giving more information about the Catholic Charities and Communities pledge drive and how you can be part of it.


