Father Bill's Weekly Message

CHILD SAFETY

On Sunday, October 2nd, our religious education students went through safe-environment training. This is required by the Diocese of Birmingham through the Office of Youth Services. Parents can "opt out" of this class, but it must be offered by the parish.

The purpose of the class is to inform the students what is appropriate and inappropriate behavior around minors. It lets them know what to expect while they are on the parish property and to report if anyone deviates from the norm for behavior around minors.

One of the basic standards we have is that there should always be at least two adult catechists per classroom. No minor or group of minors should be left alone with only one adult. We also never cover the windows that are in each door into the classroom.

All catechists are required to pass a course on child safety offered by the Diocese of Birmingham. Their certification lasts for three years and then is updated. The purpose of this certification is so the catechists can spot the signs of abuse in children. They may be the ones who assist the children in finding help to escape an unsafe environment.

Catechists are also required to submit to a background check for volunteers conducted by an agency chosen by the Diocese. These background checks let the parish know that our catechists are qualified to supervise minors. All diocesan employees who work with minors submit to a more extensive background check.

We can all be youth protectors. The basic guideline is, "If you see something, say something." Any suspicious behavior should be reported to either law enforcement or the Department of Human Services. Any suspicious behavior on the parish property should be reported either to me or to Jim Mathis, the Director of Religious Education. You do not have to prove anything. We report what we see and let qualified authorities investigate. Let us all do what we can to maintain a safe environment for our young people.



Have you ever felt like giving up on praying because it seemed like God wasn't listening?




