Today's Readings



First Reading — LORD, you love all things that exist (Wisdom 11:22—12:2).

ALL SOULS DAY

This Wednesday, November 2nd, is the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. In Latin, the noun comes before the adjective. In English, it comes after the adjective. In proper English, November 2nd would be called the Commemoration of All the Departed Faithful.

“The Faithful” is the Church’s term for the laity. In the Church’s official teaching, there are two groups: the Clergy and the Faithful. The Clergy includes all those who have received the sacrament of Holy Orders: bishops, priests, and deacons. Everyone else is part of the Faithful.

The liturgy for this day is a commemoration. We remember those members of the Faithful who have died and have yet to achieve Heaven. These are the souls who are going through the process of purification called Purgatory. The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines our belief in Purgatory this way: “All those who die in God’s grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven.” (#1030)

In Eastern Christian theology, this process is thought of as one of enlightenment, the stripping away of our illusions. In Western Christian theology, this process is thought of as penance, the stripping away of our attachment to certain sins. Either way, Purgatory is the process of final preparation to be in God’s presence perpetually.

Outside of the Canonized Saints, we don’t know who is in Heaven and who is not. That is why we pray for, “the Holy Souls in Purgatory.” We ask God that their purification be swift and tolerable. We hope they achieve Heaven, so they can pray for us when we die.

November is the month of the Holy Souls—both those in Heaven and those in Purgatory. We are joined to them through the one Lord, Jesus Christ. We hope to join with them one day in praising God in eternal life.

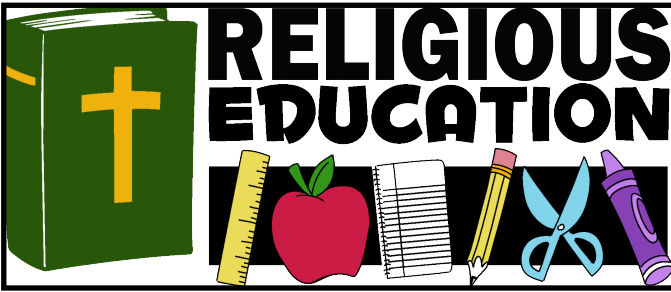
