Father Bill's Weekly Message

A SAVIOR IS BORN FOR US

Christmas has arrived! After four weeks of preparation, it is now time to celebrate the Birth of Jesus Christ. Ready or not, here He comes! Though we are celebrating His birth, it is Jesus who gives us the gift. The gift is Himself.

Babies are like that. They need the help of other human beings to survive. But they have this ability to look at us with a look that says, "I'm glad you're here!" They bring out of us a depth of love and compassion we didn't know we had. As one of my nieces once said to me, "I'm glad I know you!"

Christmas is an opportunity for us to say to Jesus, "I'm glad I know you! My life is better because you're in it." Because of their faith in Jesus, the saints experienced a depth of love and compassion they didn't know they had. Jesus, being fully human, makes us more fully human.

Jesus Christ is **the** savior. Salvation is found in no one else. In the Gospel of John, Jesus says, "I am the way and the truth and the life." (14, 6) Jesus is **the** way, not one way among many. When the excitement of Christmas has worn off, Jesus will remain. He will always be there to rescue us from sin and death.

The point of Christmas is that we would become more "Jesus-like". We can be merciful to others because Jesus has first been merciful to us. We can have the same compassion for the wayward as Jesus has shown us when we have gone astray. Then, slowly, the world will be remade in the image Jesus Christ made it in the beginning.

"The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth." (John 1, 14) Jesus Christ is near, today and all days.


