

Father Bill's Weekly Message

CHRISTIAN UNITY WEEK

January 18th through the 25th is Christian Unity Week in the United States. January 25th is the Liturgical Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, so the mainline Churches picked the week leading up to that feast as a time to strive for unity.

At the Last Supper, Jesus prayed, "I pray for those who will believe in me through their (the disciples') word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me." (John 17, 20-21) The unity of Christians is a missionary necessity because it helps people put faith in Jesus Christ.

However, if you read the New Testament, you understand that unity is a difficult goal to accomplish. There were disagreements between the apostles, between the Jewish and Gentile Christians, and even within local communities.

Since the 1950's, the Catholic Church has been working for theological unity with other Christians. It is a humbling experience because it necessitates the Catholic Church admitting our wrongs without insisting that other Christians admit their wrongs. Great strides have been made, especially with Orthodox Christians, though the war in Ukraine has been a setback to Christian unity. Both the Ukrainians and the Russians are Christian.

What is at stake in Christian unity is evangelization. Our divisions negatively impact the preaching of the Gospel and the conversion of people to Christianity. The mission entrusted to the Church by her risen Savior is compromised when those who say they follow Jesus fail to follow His teaching or way of life.

We can be proud of our Catholic faith. We can also learn from the faith and example of other Christians. All Christians need to grow in their faith. Christian Unity Week is an opportunity to strengthen our faith in Jesus Christ as the Savior of the world.






