Father Bill's Weekly Message

DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE LEGAL PROTECTION OF UNBORN CHILDREN

"On January 22, 1973, the Supreme Court legalized abortion throughout the United States in its companion decisions *Roe v. Wade* and *Doe v. Bolton*. Since that time, millions of children have lost their lives, and millions of women and families have been wounded by abortion."

"In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23 when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion." (Source: USCCB)

Prayer: Pray for women considering abortion. Pray for those who work in and benefit from the abortion industry. Pray for God to change their minds and hearts. Pray for the people who are giving their time and effort to work "on the front lines" to bring a culture of life into this culture of death. Pray for those entrusted with authority to promote a culture of life in our society.

Penance: Whatever you normally give up for Lent, give that up on January 23rd. As we do during Lent, unite your sacrifice to the sacrifice of Christ on the cross for an outpouring of God's mercy on the world. Abortion may be the clearest sign of the culture of death in the United States, but it is not the only one. Ending abortion, which can only be done with God's grace, would be a significant step in building a culture of life, but far from the last step. Personal penance also changes the individual's mind and heart. It may lead us to becoming more aware of the dignity of all human life.


