Father Bill's Weekly Message

BLESSING OF THROATS

This Friday, February 3rd, is the Memorial of St. Blaise, Bishop and Martyr. It is also the traditional day to offer a blessing for the throat.

February 2nd is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. (Forty days after Christmas.) Here we recall the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple in Jerusalem by Mary and Joseph. (Luke 2, 22-40) On this feast, candles for liturgical use are blessed.

On the following day, two of those blessed candles are shaped into a cross, which is then placed near the throat of the person being blessed. A prayer of blessing is invoked: "Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." The recipient of the blessing responds, "Amen."

St. Blaise was the bishop of Sebaste in Armenia. He was martyred sometime in the early fourth century. Legend has it that, as Blaise was being led to martyrdom, he encountered a mother and son. The son had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At the prayer of St. Blaise, the bone was dislodged, and the boy was saved.

The blessing of candles and throats are called *sacramentals*. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church: "These are sacred signs which bear a resemblance to the sacraments. They signify effects, particularly of a spiritual nature, which are obtained through the intercession of the Church. By them men are disposed to receive the chief effect of the sacraments, and various occasions of life are rendered holy." (CCC #1667)

We will also offer the Blessing of Throats following the weekend masses on February 4^{th} and 5^{th} .


