Father Bill's Weekly Message

THE ORDER OF PENANCE

The Sacred Congregation for Divine Worship has issued a new Order of Penance. The structure of the rite is the same, but the English translation has changed in small ways.

In the Introduction, there is an explanation of the meaning and purpose of the Sacrament of Penance. During Lent, this column will highlight some of the Introduction to prepare us for celebrating the sacrament either as an individual or a group.

The Introduction begins with a survey of the ministry of Reconciliation in the history of Salvation: "The Son of God, made man, dwelt among us so that he might free us from slavery to sin and call us out of darkness into his marvelous light. He therefore began his work on earth by preaching repentance: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" (Mark 1, 15)"

"Jesus, however, not only exhorted people to repent so as to leave their sins behind and turn to the Lord with all their heart, but he also welcomed sinners and reconciled them with the Father. After his Resurrection, he sent the Holy Spirit on the Apostles, that they might have the power to forgive sins and might receive the office of preaching repentance and forgiveness of sins to all the nations in his name."

"This victory over sin first shows itself in Baptism, in which the old self is crucified in Christ, that rising again with Christ, we should henceforth live for God. For this reason the Church confesses her faith in "one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins.""

"But in addition, our Savior Jesus Christ, when he conferred on his Apostles the power to forgive sins, instituted the Sacrament of Penance in his Church, so that the faithful who had fallen into sin after their bath of regeneration might be renewed in grace and reconciled with God. For the Church "has both water and tears: the water of Baptism and the tears of Penance." (St. Ambrose)"

Lenten Regulations

Lent runs from Ash Wednesday (February 22) until the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday (April 6). "The faithful, listening more intensely to the word of God and devoting themselves to prayer, are prepared through a spirit of repentance to renew their baptismal promises (at Easter)." (Ceremonial of Bishops, #249)

Fasting: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fast for those ages 18 through 59. Only one full meal is allowed, though a person may eat two smaller meals to maintain strength.

<u>Abstinence:</u> Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, plus all the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat for those ages 14 and older.

<u>Confession:</u> It is recommended that all Catholics celebrate the sacrament of Penance during the Lent or Easter seasons (February 22-May 28).




