## Father Bill's Weekly Message

## THE ORDER OF PENANCE

The Fourth part of the Introduction to the revised Order of Penance is entitled: "The Necessity and Usefulness of This Sacrament".

From the Introduction: "Just as the wound of sin is varied and manifold in the life of individuals and of the community, so too the remedy which Penance offers to us is of various kinds. Thus, those who have fallen away by grave sin from the communion of the love of God are called back through the Sacrament of Penance to the life that they had lost. And those who fall into venial sins as a result of daily weakness receive strength through the repeated celebration of Penance, in order to attain the full freedom of the children of God."

- "a) To obtain the saving remedy of the Sacrament of Penance, according to the design of the merciful God, the faithful must confess to the Priest each and every grave sin which, after examining his (her) conscience, he (she) can remember."
- "b) Moreover, the frequent and diligent use of this Sacrament is very useful, even for venial sins. For it is...a continuous striving to perfect the grace of Baptism, so that, as we carry in our bodies the death of Jesus Christ, the life of Jesus may be manifested in us more and more." (2Corinthians 4: 10)

"In order that this Sacrament of salvation may really exercise its power in Christ's faithful, it is necessary that it should take root in their whole life and move them to more fervent service of God and their brothers and sisters."

"Regular celebration of this Sacrament is thus always an act in which the Church proclaims her faith, gives thanks to God for the freedom by which Christ has made us free, and offers her life as a spiritual sacrifice in praise of the glory of God as she hastens to meet Christ."



#### Jesus Heals a Blind Man

In today's Gospel story, Jesus met a man who couldn't see. This man was born blind. Jesus decided to heal the man. He took some dirt, and he mixed it with his own spit, to make mud! Umm, eew? Then he spread that mud on the blind man's eyes! Jesus told him to go wash up in a pool, and when the man did, he could see again! It was a miracle! Some people weren't too happy about this, though. Some people didn't believe it was the same man as the one who had been born blind. Some people were angry because Jesus did "work" on the Holy Sabbath day, since He made mud and healed someone. They were so suspicious and upset that they missed out on appreciating this great miracle. They closed their eyes, in a way.

Did you know we have eyes in our hearts? Not actual eyeballs, of course...but we can think about seeing with our hearts when we consider our attitudes towards God and one another. If your thoughts and your actions are focused on yourself, it's hard to have a "vision" or see outside your own little problems and needs. You might be able to look at things with your eyes, but you'll be "blinded" to what God is doing, or to the things other people need and are doing. It's like closing your eyes, or wearing goggles that don't let you look around.
