Father Bill's Weekly Message

ALLELUIA!

"Alleluia!" "Praise the Lord!" Despite our best efforts to choose death over life, God has defeated death in the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Every Sunday is a day to celebrate the resurrection, but especially this Sunday!

We still live in a culture of death, just look around, but the love of God is stronger than death. The love of God is stronger than any force that would oppose God or His will.

When we went to sleep last night, we were certain the sun would rise this morning. We should have the same faith that the Son of God will save us from sin and death. It has happened enough where there is no reason for doubt.

The question is do we want the life Christ provides for us or do we want some other way of life? We know where the way of Jesus Christ leads: to resurrection and new life. But Christ leaves us free to choose some other way if we desire. In choosing Christ's way, we are choosing long-term gain. But we are always free to choose some other way which gives us short-term gain. Whatever way that is, it leads to long-term ruin.

So, rejoice! Jesus Christ has saved us, not because we deserve it, but because He loves us. His love is undying. It endures forever. We are free to reject His love. We are also free to accept it.

The love of God has conquered sin and death in Jesus Christ. Alleluia!

Magnificat is a ministry to Catholic women whose purpose is to help women be open to the Holy Spirit through a deeper commitment of their lives to Jesus Christ. The entire scene of the Visitation in Luke 1:46 is the inspiration for the Magnificat Ministry, which adopts the name of Mary's hymn of praise and the spirit of this Biblical encounter between Mary and Elizabeth.

Magnificat meals are held four times a year. The program includes a shared meal, praise and worship, and a speaker who shares God's work in her life. The Magnificat Ministry also provides other opportunities for spiritual growth, such as: Retreats, Bible Studies, Life in the Spirit Seminars, and Intercessory Prayer Groups.


