MISSIONARY CHURCH

Next weekend we have a special collection for Catholic Home Missions. This collection goes to dioceses throughout the United States and its dependencies to help with the spreading of the Gospel.

Not every diocese is considered a Mission Diocese, but the Church is Missionary in nature. The Church "goes out" to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with those who need to hear it. Pope Francis, in his Apostolic Exhortation, <u>The</u> Joy of the Gospel, wrote that he envisions a Church of "missionary disciples" who go forth to bring the love of Jesus Christ to those in most need of it.

The Diocese of Birmingham is considered a "Mission Diocese." We bring in priests and religious to help us spread the Gospel. When I was ordained in 1990, 40% of our diocesan priests were born in Ireland. These brave men left their homeland to minister in Alabama.

There were religious sisters and brothers from around the world who came to our diocese to serve the Church and its members. We may remember the Benedictines, the Trinitarians, the Sisters of Mercy, the Vincentians, the Daughters of Charity and many other religious congregations who ministered in our diocese.

Today, the Church is experiencing tremendous growth in Asia, Africa, and South America. So, it is no surprise that missionaries are coming from those places to minister in the Diocese of Birmingham. At the same time, priests and religious are going from the United States to be missioners in other countries. That is because the Church is missionary in nature. The Good News of Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, is too important to keep it to ourselves. It must be proclaimed to the whole world!

MEDICAID EXPANSION

With the reversal of the Roe vs. Wade Supreme Court decision, abortion is now illegal in Alabama. That means the expansion of Medicaid is a Pro-life issue. With more poor women carrying their babies to term, pre-natal and post-natal care will need to be increased, especially in rural areas of our state.

If you support mothers and their babies, then ogically you must support an increase in medical care for women and children as an alternative to abortion. In Alabama, that means the expansion of Medicaid.


