Father Bill's Weekly Message

THE EASTER SEASON

The Easter Season lasts for 50 days. It ends at the conclusion of Pentecost Sunday, on May 28th this year. We have been through three weeks of Easter. There are four weeks to go.

The liturgy during the Easter Season invites us to contemplate the teachings of Jesus Christ. These words come from the Risen Lord rather than from some wise human being. We look at the words and actions of Jesus through the lens of the resurrection. We can appreciate them anew as the words of God.

Perhaps that is why the Easter Season is longer than the Season of Lent. It takes more time for us to grasp the meaning of Jesus' teaching. And we will also observe Easter every year, so whatever we miss this year we can contemplate next year.

Jesus Christ is alive. His words are living words that He speaks today rather than words of a figure from the past that must be understood in their historical context. Jesus is the truth. His WORDS apply to every generation, not exclusively to one generation.

For catechumens, those who were initiated into the Church at the Easter Vigil, the 50 days of Easter are called the period of *Mystagogue*. It is a time of a more complete revealing of the mystery of faith. The same can be true for all of us. Contemplating the Word of God, we can all deepen our faith in Jesus Christ, the Risen Lord.

Jesus Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

MEDICAID EXPANSION

With the reversal of the Roe vs. Wade Supreme Court decision, abortion is now illegal in Alabama. That means the expansion of Medicaid is a Pro-life issue. 
