Father Bill's Weekly Message

THE SOLEMNITY OF PENTECOST

The Easter season concludes this Sunday with the Solemnity of Pentecost. We will have completed the 50 days (Hence, "Pente") of joyful reflection on the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

There was already a Hebrew festival of Pentecost. It occurred 50 days after Passover. It was a commemoration of the Ten Commandments, given to the people of Israel from Mt. Sinai 50 days after the first Passover. The people's acceptance of the covenant with God made them God's peoplethe people of Israel.

On the first observance of Pentecost following Jesus' resurrection, the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus' disciples, and they became the "New Israel."- the Church.

Of course, the Church, as "those who belong to the Lord", already existed. It might be more accurate to say the Church's missionary activity began on Pentecost. Jesus told the disciples, "(T)hat repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And behold, I am sending the promise of my Father upon you; but stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high." (Luke 24, 46-49)

What began on that first Pentecost day following Jesus' resurrection was the preaching of the Gospel. It was the joyful message that Jesus had risen from the dead and was the source of salvation!

Like the many graduations that occur this time of year, it was a beginning of a new phase in the life of the disciples of Jesus Christ. The disciples had finished their training. Now they were impelled by the Holy Spirit to continue the mission of Jesus Christ to draw all people to Himself.

The Church's missionary activity continues today. We are a community of "missionary disciples" bringing love from the risen Lord Jesus Christ to those in most need of it. We are empowered by the Holy Spirit for that mission.
