Father Bill's Weekly Message

FATHER'S DAY

The third Sunday in June is Father's Day in the United States. It is a day to honor the men who have helped us to become adults who can provide for ourselves and others.

God is the eternal Father. Therefore, God is the model of fatherhood for all men. God is the Creator of all life. God is the protector of the weak. God teaches us by example how to relate to others. God wants to keep His family together and is willing to sacrifice to do so.

We are the sons and daughters of God. Jesus is the only begotten Son of God, but we are adopted children of God. (Galatians 4, 5) God loves us the way He loves His only begotten Son. The Son shows us how to relate to the Father.

As children of God, we are supposed to trust in the Father and follow His ways. Through the Son, the Father has given us an example of how to live. The Son learned it from the Father and left us an example to follow. (Philippians 2, 1-11) Jesus is the way, but we are free to choose His way or follow some other way. The Father has shown us the way of life but leaves us free to choose another way.

The Gospel of Luke contains the parable called "The Prodigal Son" (15, 11-32). The word prodigal means wasteful. The parable could also be called "The Prodigal Father". Even after all the son has wasted, the father welcomes him home. The father prioritizes having his son home with him over anything the son may have done. The parable is about God the Father. What God wants more than anything else is to have us "home" with Him. But like the son in the parable, we have to "come to our senses" (v. 17). We have to change our mind. We have to repent.
