Today's Readings



First Reading — As the visions during the night continued, I saw: One like a Son of man coming, on the clouds of heaven (David 7:9-10. 13-14).

Father Bill's Weekly Message

THE TRANSFIGURATION

August 6th is the Feast of The Transfiguration on the Church's liturgical calendar. When August 6th falls on a Sunday, The Transfiguration is observed instead of the Sunday in Ordinary Time.

The scripture passages narrating the Transfiguration, today from Matthew's Gospel, all place the event immediately following Jesus' first prediction of His passion to His disciples. He takes Peter, James, and John with Him to the top of a mountain and is "transfigured" in their presence. His appearance changes and He is like a being of light.

In other words, Peter, James, and John get a preview of Jesus in His glorified state. The way they see Jesus on the Mount of Transfiguration is the way they will see Jesus when they reach Heaven. The way that all will see Jesus when they reach eternal life. Jesus is transfigured and the disciples see Him as he really is.

The Transfiguration was meant to give the disciples hope. They would suffer for the gospel just as Jesus would. But like Jesus, they would be transfigured in the resurrection.

The Feast of the Transfiguration occurs
Forty days before the Feast of The Triumph of
the Cross. The two feasts are connected. One
leads to the other. The passion of Jesus Christ
will lead to His glorification in the resurrection.
The same is true for us. The suffering of this life,
borne with patience and faith, leads to our
transfiguration. We resemble more and more the
risen and glorified Jesus Christ.

Jesus' transfiguration happened instantaneously because of His union with the Father. Our transfiguration happens more gradually because our faith needs to grow. It will grow if we remain faithful in our discipleship of Jesus Christ.




