Father Bill's Weekly Message

The Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary

August 22nd is the Memorial of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In the old calendar, the memorial was observed on May 31st - hence the tradition of a "May Crowning". The revision of the liturgical calendar following the Second Vatican Council moved the memorial to the eighth day in the octave of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary to emphasize the connection between the two doctrines.

In the Old Testament, the Queen of Israel or Judah was the **mother** of the king, rather than the wife of the king. This gave legitimacy to the king's claim to the throne, since he was the legitimate son of the previous king. King David had many sons with his many wives, but Solomon, the son of Bathsheba, was chosen as his successor. When Solomon became king, Bathsheba became queen.

Jesus Christ is our King. That means Mary is our Queen. If we recognize Jesus as our king, as subjects of the kingdom of God, then we recognize Mary, His mother, as our queen. As is the case with all titles given to Mary, it comes from her relationship to her son and savior.

As our Queen, Mary intercedes to Christ the King for our needs. She is compassionate. She takes to heart the needs of the Father's children because they are her children as well. Her example of humility is one from which we can all learn. As we read in Psalm 51: "A humbled, contrite heart, O God, you will not spurn."

Jesus Christ proved His love for us by "dying for us sinners." Mary proved her love for us by saying, "Yes" to being the mother of Jesus Christ; to being the Mother of God. The Memorial of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary reminds us of the depths and lengths of God's love for us.



Does God Only Care for the Chosen People?

Long ago God had set aside the Israelites as His chosen people. He gave them laws and prophets and set up a covenant with them, that they would be His people and He would be their God. He promised them that He would send them a Savior.

When Jesus the Savior came, His first mission was to care for God's chosen people. In today's Gospel reading, however, a woman who was not an Israelite came to ask Jesus for help. At first Jesus refused—He had been sent to God's children and "it is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs." But the woman said, "even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from the Master's table." She knew that Jesus could help her. When He saw how much faith she had, He did what she asked and cured her daughter.

Jesus wasn't trying to make the woman give up. He was giving her a chance to show how much humility and faith she had. Jesus used this to show the people that God will let anyone who believes, like this woman, become part of His chosen people.


