## WORK

In our technological age and culture, manual labor is looked down upon as an evil. It was not always so. It's unclear to me why we still have Labor Day when manual labor is seen as a curse. The Catholic view of work is different.

In the Catholic faith, work as seen as a sharing in God's creative activity. In work, human beings use their God-given abilities to support their families, to better society, and to express their humanity, made in the image and likeness of God. This is the dignity of work.

It is not only the duty of individuals to find work that accomplishes these three purposes, but also the duty of society to create the conditions that make dignified work possible. Profit motive alone will not guarantee this outcome. The government alone will not guarantee this outcome.

What is needed is cooperation between employers and employees. There needs to be a shared vision of the purposes of work. There needs to be an "up front" understanding of the goals of work. If there is "buy in" from employers and employees, everyone can benefit from work.

In 1891 Pope Leo XIII wrote an encyclical on labor, "Rerum Novarum". In 1991 Pope St. John Paul II marked the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of that encyclical by authoring "Centesimus Annus". These papal writings can be read with profit for understanding the dignity of work.




