Father Bill's Weekly Message

STEWARDSHIP

This weekend our parish will have a stewardship drive. Different organizations and ministries will be looking for volunteers to give their time and talent to bring Jesus Christ's love to those in need of it.

In the New Testament Jesus tells parables about stewards who are left in charge of their masters' possessions while the master is absent. That is what a steward is: someone who takes care of what belongs to another. They are not the owner, but they are to do what the owner would do in the owner's absence. St. Paul refers to the apostles as, "stewards of the mysteries of God." (1Corinthians 4, 1)

Stewardship in the Church means serving God by using our time and talent to be His instruments in representing the Catholic Church wherever we are. There are many ministries sponsored by the parish and the Diocese of Birmingham that need people to serve.

The Stewardship Fair in our parish this weekend is not about getting something. It is about giving our time and talent to make our parish an instrument Jesus Christ can use to bring His mercy and salvation to all in need of it.

Following all masses, representatives from the different ministries will be available in the parish hall to answer questions and to sign up volunteers. Later, each ministry will have its own training or orientation to get you started in service. We also ask those who are already serving to re-commit themselves for another year.

St. Theresa of Avila (1515-1582) wrote, "Christ has no body now on earth but yours, no hands, no feet but yours. Yours are the eyes with which Christ looks out with compassion to the world. Yours are the feet with which he is to go about doing good. Yours are the hands with which he is to bless us now."

The Stewardship Fair is an opportunity to become Christ's instrument in the world.







