# Father Bill's Weekly Message


#### THE BISHOPS' SYNOD

The XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops will open this week in the Vatican. Since 1968 the bishops of the world have been called together by the Bishop of Rome 15 times to advise him on matters important to the Church. Some of the topics discussed at previous synods include the missionary nature of the Church, education, the family, and priestly formation. The bishops meet in synod approximately every four years.

These synods never discuss changes in doctrine, but rather what to do to make the Church's doctrine become a living reality in the Church and in the world. Reflections on doctrine would require an ecumenical council, not a synod. The topic for discussion in this synod is the concept of synodality: How the Church listens to its members in order to more effectively transmit the Gospel.

On the web site of the United States
Catholic Conference of Bishops we read: "Pope
Francis invites the entire Church to reflect on a
theme that is decisive for its life and mission: "It is
precisely this path of synodality which God
expects of the Church of the third millennium."
This journey, which follows in the wake of the
Church's "renewal" proposed by the Second
Vatican Council, is both a gift and a task: by
journeying together and reflecting together on the
journey that has been made, the Church will be
able to learn through Her experience which
processes can help Her to live communion, to
achieve participation, to open Herself to
mission."

Pope Francis is from the Southern hemisphere. He has a different view of the Church than those of us who live in the Northern hemisphere. He wants the Church to listen to its members, not to change the Church's teaching, but to more effectively live its teaching. Please pray for the bishops and other advisors who will be meeting in Vatican City beginning this week.


