Father Bill's Weekly Message

SOUTHERN HEMISPHERE VS NORTHERN HEMISPHERE

Recently, there have been surveys, news articles, and homilies about the sad state of the Catholic Church. While it is true that the Church is shrinking in the Northern Hemisphere (North America and Europe), it is growing in the Southern Hemisphere (Africa, Asia, and South America).

Perhaps one reason is that for the last 500 years the Northern Hemisphere, through the "Enlightenment", has based its understanding of religion on **pride**. The goal of the Northern Hemisphere is to raise all people up. It was only a matter of time before people would have no need for God.

The Southern Hemisphere has based its understanding of religion on **humility**. The goal of the Church in the Southern Hemisphere is to be one with suffering people: to lower oneself instead of making the other become like you. It is like the teaching of Jesus in the Gospel of Mark: "whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and give his life for the ransom of many." (10, 44-45)

Because of the education system in the Southern Hemisphere, there is a shortage of religious vocations. However, the Catholic Church is growing in numbers. In the Northern Hemisphere, it is only the influx of immigrants from Central and South America that keeps the numbers of Catholics steady in North America. If European nations allowed more immigration from Africa and Asia, the Church would maintain its size there, too.

Pope Francis is from the Southern
Hemisphere. He has a different view of the
purpose of the Church. In, "The Joy of the Gospel",
he compared the Church to "a field hospital." Its
purpose is to bring healing to a broken world. He
proposes a Church of "missionary disciples"
rather than a "maintenance" Church.




Saturday, October 28th 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.


